



I'm busy enough, I work and volunteer time with numerous other school and community organizations. I helped with other CC fundraisers last year. I took a register on the far end and met a band parent I would otherwise not have known. John put me at ease. He was friendly, likable, helpful and very patient with all my questions. He showed me how to use the register and helped me serve my first customers. Thankfully, he was there to assist me throughout the night whenever I got stuck.

My family worked as a team, parents on the registers and kids our runners. Food Network here we come. We had time to eat dinner before the game started and have a snack later ('gratis', i.e. free). Nachos were the hot sale item, maybe because the runners loaded them with so much cheese. We had fun with and enjoyed the customers, the mom with 6 happy kids, dads with young daughters, the hot British guys, the classy lady with chardonnay in a plastic cup, the college bros, the big brother mentor with the hungry teenage boys, the little boy who was so excited to place his own order and pay for it himself. Time flew by and before we knew it we were on our way home by ten-ish.

We were pleasantly surprised by the whole experience. A tidy, clean concession stand to work in and amiable people to work with. No complaints here. I was impressed with Sodexo's attention to food safety and prep. Kids and adults working together to support the band and keep the band fees low. Fun, low pressure, easy, non-stressful work. My family and I agreed what made it even more fun was doing it together and with a band buddy. I see volunteering at Crew in a different light now and my excuses don't hold as much weight as they once did . . .
